4           Plaintiff, Technology Licensing Company Inc., complains of and for causes of action  
5 against Defendant, Epson America, Inc., alleges as follows:

7                                   Nature of the Case

8           1.   This is an action arising under the Patent Laws and Statutes of the United States in  
9 which Plaintiff seeks to recover for patent infringement, and for inducing patent infringement, and  
10 for contributory infringement, and for any and all damages and costs flowing therefrom.

12                                   Jurisdiction and Venue

13           2.   The Court has exclusive jurisdiction of the patent infringement claim, the inducement  
14 of patent infringement claim, and the contributory infringement claim, all asserted in this case  
15 pursuant to the Patent Laws and Statutes of the United States (e.g., 35 U.S.C. §§ 271, *et seq.* and §  
16 281) including 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331, 1338, 2201-2202. Venue is proper in this district under 28  
17 U.S.C § 1391.

19                                   The Parties

20           3.   Plaintiff, Technology Licensing Company Inc. ("Plaintiff") is a California Corporation  
21 with a principal place of business in Nicasio, California.

23           4.   Defendant, Epson America Inc. ("Defendant") is a California Corporation having a  
24 principal place of business in Long Beach, CA 90810.

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Plaintiff's Patent

5. Plaintiff is the owner of United States No.5,734,862 ("the Patent") which was duly issued on March 31, 1998. The Patent concerns *inter alia* embodiments for a system and method for making and/or viewing DVDs. Plaintiff has licensed the Patent to more than 20 (twenty) manufacturers and/or sellers of DVD Players

**COUNT I**

**(Patent Infringement)**

6. This COUNT is instituted against Defendant for infringement (i.e., direct infringement) of the Patent.

9. On information and belief, at least one embodiment of the invention of the Patent which Defendant is infringing, and/or has infringed, operates, at least in part, in accordance with and/or complies, at least in part, with technical standards generally adhered to by the DVD Player Industry.

10. On information and belief, at least one embodiment of the invention of the Patent which Defendant is infringing, or has infringed, operates at least in part in accordance with and/or

2 SPECIFICATIONS," Version 1.13, March 2002, published by DVD Format/Logo Licensing

5 11. Plaintiff has suffered damages by reason of Defendant's infringement of the Patent,  
6 and will suffer additional damages unless Defendant is enjoined by the Court from continuing to  
7 infringe the Patent.

9 12. On information and belief, Defendant's infringement of the Patent has been willful  
10 and deliberate, thus warranting an increase of the damages recoverable by Plaintiff under the  
11 provisions of 35 U.S.C. § 284, up to three times the amount of actual damages sustained by  
12 Plaintiff, and also making this an exceptional case within the meaning of 35 U.S.C. § 285.

25 16. On information and belief, when Defendant makes and sells and/or offers to sell to  
26 persons, embodiments of the invention of the Patent in this Judicial District and elsewhere in the

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1 United States, the sales are accompanied with documents, written instructions, and/or other  
 2 instructions, from Defendant on how to operate embodiments of the invention of the Patent.

 4 17. On information and belief, when Defendant accompanies its sales and/or offers to sell  
 5 to persons with documents, written instructions, and/or other instructions, on how to operate  
 6 embodiments of the invention of the Patent, Defendant was and is aware that such documents,  
 7 written instructions, and/or other instructions, are inducing the persons to infringe the claims of  
 8 the Patent. On further information and belief, Defendant thereby has actively induced and/or is  
 9 actively inducing the persons in this Judicial District and elsewhere in the United States to infringe  
 10 the claims of the Patent.

 13 18. On information and belief, at least one embodiment of the invention of the Patent  
 14 which Defendant is actively inducing infringement, and/or has actively induced infringement,  
 15 operates, at least in part, in accordance with and/or complies, at least in part, with technical  
 16 standards generally adhered to by the DVD Player Industry.

 19 19. On information and belief, at least one embodiment of the invention of the Patent  
 20 which Defendant is actively inducing infringement, and/or has actively induced infringement,  
 21 operates, at least in part, in accordance with and/or complies at least in part with "DVD  
 22 Specifications for read-Only Disc, Part 3 VIDEO SPECIFICATIONS," Version 1.13, March  
 23 2002, published by DVD Format/Logo Licensing Corporation.

25 20. Plaintiff has suffered damages by reason of Defendant's active inducement of  
 26 infringement of the Patent, and will suffer additional damages unless Defendant is enjoined by the  
 27 Court from continuing to actively induce the infringement of the Patent.

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1           21. On information and belief, Defendant's active inducement of the infringement of the  
2 Patent has been willful and deliberate, thus warranting an increase of the damages recoverable by  
3 Plaintiff under the provisions of 35 U.S.C. § 284, up to three times the amount of actual damages  
4 sustained by Plaintiff, and also making this an exceptional case within the meaning of 35 U.S.C. §  
5 285.

10                               **(Contributory Infringement)**

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12           22. This COUNT is instituted against Defendant for contributory infringement the Patent.

13           23. Plaintiff repeats and realleges the allegations set forth in paragraphs 1-5.

14           24. On information and belief, the embodiments of the invention made and sold by  
15 Defendant to persons in this Judicial District and elsewhere in the United States constitute a  
16 material part of embodiments of the invention of the Patent. On further information and belief,  
17 Defendant knew and knows that such manufacture and sale of embodiments of the invention were  
18 and are especially made or especially adapted for use in infringement of the claims of the Patent,  
19 and that the embodiments of the invention were and are not staple articles or commodities of  
20 commerce suitable for substantial non-infringing use. Accordingly, on further information and  
21 belief Defendant has contributory infringed, and/or is contributory infringing, in this Judicial  
22 District and elsewhere in the United States the claims of the Patent.

25           25. On information and belief, at least one embodiment of the invention of the Patent  
26 which Defendant is contributory infringing, and/or has contributory infringed, operates, at least in  
27

1 part, in accordance with and/or complies, at least in part, with technical standards generally  
 2 adhered to by the DVD Player Industry.

 4 26. On information and belief, at least one embodiment of the invention of the Patent  
 5 which Defendant is contributory infringing, and/or has contributory infringed, operates, at least in  
 6 part, in accordance with and/or complies, at least in part, with "DVD Specifications for read-Only  
 7 Disc, Part 3 VIDEO SPECIFICATIONS," Version 1.13, March 2002, published by DVD  
 8 Format/Logo Licensing Corporation.

10 27. Plaintiff has suffered damages by reason of Defendant's contributory infringement of  
 11 the Patent, and will suffer additional damages unless Defendant is enjoined by the Court from  
 12 continuing contributory infringement of the Patent.  
 13

14 28. On information and belief, Defendant's contributory infringement of the Patent has  
 15 been willful and deliberate, thus warranting an increase of the damages recoverable by Plaintiff  
 16 under the provisions of 35 U.S.C. § 284, up to three times the amount of actual damages sustained  
 17 by Plaintiff, and also making this an exceptional case within the meaning of 35 U.S.C. § 285.  
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## 22 RELIEF

23  
 24 WHEREFOR PLAINTIFF PRAYS:

25 (a) For decree and judgment against Defendant and all in privity with Defendant that the  
 26 Patent is valid and enforceable;  
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1 (b) For decree and judgment against Defendant and all in privity with Defendant, that the  
2 Patent is, and has been, infringed by Defendant and that Defendant is liable as a patent infringer;

3  
4 (c) For decree and judgment against Defendant and all in privity with Defendant, that the  
5 Patent is, and has been, infringed by active inducement of infringement by Defendant and that  
6 Defendant is liable as an active inducer of infringement;

7  
8 (d) For decree and judgment against Defendant and all in privity with Defendant, that the  
9 Patent is, and has been, contributory infringed by Defendant and that Defendant is liable as a  
10 contributory infringer;

11  
12 (e) For an accounting for, and an assignment of, an award of profits derived by Defendant  
13 and damages suffered by Plaintiff in consequence of the patent infringement, the active  
14 inducement of patent infringement, and the contributory infringement, of the Patent;

15  
16 (f) For a decree and judgment against Defendant trebling the profits derived by Defendant  
17 and damages suffered by Plaintiff pursuant to statute (e.g., 35 U.S.C. § 284);

18  
19 (g) For an injunction permanently enjoining Defendant, its officers, agents, servants,  
20 employees, attorneys and all those in active concert, participation or privity with Defendant from  
21 further infringement, and/or active inducement and/or contributory infringement, in any form  
22 what ever, of the Patent;

23  
24 (h) For the costs of this suit, reasonable attorney's fees as provided by statute (e.g., 35  
25 U.S.C. § 285), and an assessment of interest and cost against the Defendant;

26 (i) For prejudgment interest at the maximum rate allowed by law;  
27

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1 (j) For post judgment interest at the maximum rate allowed by law, from the date of the  
2 judgment until paid; and

3  
4 (k) For such other and further relief which should appear just and equitable to this Court.

6 **DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL**

8 In accordance with Civil Local Rule No. 3-6, Plaintiff requests for a trial by jury.
